


Good News!

FROM TRAGEDY & TRAUMA TO A NEW & BETTER LIFE

Susan's past includes drug abuse, incarceration, loss of parental rights, and the loss of a child, but the good news is that is her past, not her present and future. In the midst of it all, Susan called on the Lord. He heard and answered her, and she submitted her life to Him. Susan said, "*Through this journey, I learned to persevere, to keep fighting against all odds. What man says is impossible, God says is possible.*" She now has custody of all four of her children, is a great mom, and is employed full time. She works with a

rehabilitation organization and is working toward seeing her vision to open a school for trauma impacted children come to pass. Susan told us, "I have never been so happy in my life. God has blessed me beyond belief and Helping Hands is a huge part of that. I want to thank God for always providing for us and giving me the strength to carry on." Our Heart & Mission

Helping Hands helps at-risk women and children struggling with homelessness or other extreme needs build new and better lives, giving help for the present and hope for the future. We do this by providing transitional housing, practical assistance, and transformational discipleship in the context of a Christ-centered community.

We help people build better lives by breaking down the mission into three key areas: better hearts, better families, and better finances. God has taken our residents that were formerly on a path to destruction and has rescued their destinies, giving them a new opportunity to build a godly legacy.

Better Families

An essential part of our mission is helping residents build better families. Residents come to us with a variety of needs and challenges that we help meet and overcome. Most come from backgrounds of trauma that affect the whole family. We are often helping our residents work toward parent-child reunification or transition after a reunification. The process of working toward reunification, transitioning after a reunification, or working through the family issues that caused separation in the first place often cause a lot of stress. This stress can force some to focus on striving rather than thriving and may increase the disconnect between the parent and child.

When this love and trust-based connection is missing or damaged, it often shows up in the behavior of the children. The needs and behaviors of children who have faced long-term stress and trauma cannot always be remedied by traditional means. When our moms gain a greater understanding of the complexity of childhood trauma and its effects on the emotional and behavioral lives of their children, they are better equipped to address their childrens' needs.

Circle of Security

Joy Zedler of The Pearl Project recently began teaching a class for our moms titled Circle of Security. It equips our moms to respond to their childrens' trauma-induced behaviors in a way that meets their emotional needs and forms healthy attachments. In the process, this brings relational healing, better emotional management, and improved behavior. In addition to the wonderful opportunity Joy has presented with the Circle of Security, The Pearl Project is working with several of our residents on an individual basis. They are helping them fill their toolboxes with the knowledge and skills to relate to their children in ways that meet their emotional needs, correct adverse behaviors, and help them regulate their emotions.

Angelee's Experience

We love getting feedback from our moms about the great things they are learning that are helping them build lasting godly legacies. One of our residents, Angelee, had this to say about her participation in the Circle of Security classes and outside involvement with The Pearl Project:



"As a mother of three boys and coming from a rough background with deep rooted trauma and improperly fixed mindsets, getting involved with The Pearl Project and taking Circle of Security has been life changing. I have been able to see that there are other ways to raise children besides the ways I was raised. Being able to build trust with my sons and see all of the applied knowledge I've learned come into fruition has been amazing! I also love my mentor Ruth. She is such an amazing woman who loves the Lord. I am learning to trust again myself, and others, which is helping me be able to truly commit to the parent training I am receiving. I am so thankful that I get to experience this in real time, and I know that there is so much more in the future."
